The Role of the FDA... to keep us safe... right?

- Dr David Graham says circumstances at the FDA became such that he felt forced blow the whistle - he said he had to protect consumers from dangerous drugs.
- Dr Graham reckons Vioxx harmed at least 88,000 people, of which at least one third died.
- He claimed during a TV program called Nightline (ABC TV) that he felt the situation had forced him to speak.
- Dr Graham said during the Nightline program, "We have a system that is **biased toward approving drugs** almost regardless of the safety risks."
- Any reason will be looked for to approve a drug, unless there's an overwhelming safety reason not to approve a drug."
- Dr Graham is one of the top FDA scientists.

- During his 20 years at the FDA he has overseen the recalling of 10 drugs.
- Graham reckons the FDA dragged its feet and should have told people about the risks earlier on.
- He said that if things had been different the drug would have been banned in 2000 (as soon as study results were known).
- Many Americans wonder why the import ban on prescription drugs should carry on.
- President Bush had told the public that drugs approved in the USA gave US citizens a guarantee of quality and safety.

- Strattera causes “Severe Liver Damage”
- Lilly to add **suicidal thoughts warning** to Strattera label (Strattera will now carry a "black box" warning, the strongest required by U.S. regulators. Such warnings typically hurt sales of products by raising concern among doctors and patients about the safety of a drug.)

The latest in the line of ADD-ADHD drugs, Strattera is a “non-stimulant” ADD-ADHD drug.

Eli Lilly warned doctors that, Strattera, its drug to fight attention deficit disorder drug has caused **severe liver injury** in at least two patients. The announcements resulted in the three companies losing a total of \$30 billion in stock value.

Side Effects According to Eli Lilly

- Stomach upset, nausea

- Vomiting
- Constipation
- **Fatigue**
- Loss of appetite
- Dry mouth
- Dizziness
- Trouble sleeping
- Menstrual cycle changes
- Mood changes may occur

If any of these effects persist or worsen, notify your doctor or pharmacist promptly. Tell your doctor immediately if any of these serious side effects occur: **decreased interest in sex**, difficulty urinating. Tell your doctor immediately if any of these unlikely but serious side effects occur: weight loss, unusually fast heartbeat, severe headache, blurred vision. An allergic reaction to this drug is unlikely, but seek immediate medical attention if it occurs. Symptoms of an allergic reaction include: rash, itching, swelling, severe dizziness, trouble breathing. If you notice other effects not listed above, contact your doctor or pharmacist

"I was put on strattera (80mg). I have had almost all of the side effects, but in time, most went away except for the following: I found that I can't keep my weight up. I keep losing about 15 pounds and have trouble getting it back on. I also found that my hands shake more than they should. Is there anything I can do to increase my appetite and reduce the nervousness? Could the nervousness be due to excessive weight loss? Thanks for any suggestions."

- Adderall is a Stimulant Drug that stimulates nerve cells in the brain. It is used to treat narcolepsy. It is also used in persons with an attention deficit disorder who show signs of hyperactivity.
- Amphetamine with **high potential for abuse**, controlled substance, may lead to drug dependence, may exacerbate behavior disturbances and thought disorders, and psychotic episodes.

Other side effects reported include twitching, sweating, flushing, muscle tremor, change in sexual desire or ability. If any of these effects continue or become bothersome, inform your doctor promptly. Notify your doctor promptly if you develop: chest pain, rapid heartbeat, mental/mood changes. **This medication causes dizziness and can affect alertness.** Use caution driving or operating machinery while taking this medication. If you notice other effects not listed above, contact your doctor or pharmacist.
